The Amateur Gardeners of Milton, in recognition of Milton's 350th anniversary, gave a major "facelift" to the grounds at Town Hall in time for the Big Weekend. Please take a look at the the roses in front of the World War I memorial, some new (in process) plantings at the Civil War Memorial and, most significantly, a complete redesign of the large areas on both sides of the walkways directly in front of the building including the engraved boulder commemorating Milton's 350th. The Amateurs undertook this effort in concert with one of their members, Nancy Lattanzio of Lattanzio Landscape, starting 2 years ago with the replanting of the horseshoe area in front of the Gazebo with roses, ornamental grasses, perennials and flowering bulbs.
